HISTORY

The following depicts the accomplishment of seven school districts in the formation of a larger administrative unit to bring about a better educational program and modern educational facilities. This has been an outstanding project which is being duplicated in many other areas of the Commonwealth.

The Lackawanna Trail Joint School system is composed of seven districts, namely, Dalton Borough, La Plume Township, West Abington Township, (all in Lackawanna County), Clinton Township, Factoryville Borough, Nicholson Borough and Nicholson Township, (all in Wyoming County).

The Lackawanna Trail Jointure had its inception at a preliminary meeting held at Benton Township School on March 16, 1953. On April 20, 1953, at Dalton, Articles of Agreement, later amended, were signed by the seven above-named districts. At this meeting the following officers were elected: President, Benjamin Trapani, Factoryville Board;

Vice President, Amil P. Loch, Nicholson Township Board; Secretary, Walter E. Haussler, Sr., Dalton Board; Treasurer, George Wesley Herron, Jr., Nicholson Board.

After numerous meetings several sites were considered for the new junior-senior high school building. On August 24, 1954, a site comprising approximately 28 acres of land, was formally agreed upon for construction of the new building at Tunnel Hill, Wyoming County. Final approval of the new building was secured from the Department of Public Instruction at Harrisburg on September 16, 1954.

This new building provides enrichment to the limited curriculums previously offered in the three high schools serving this area. In addition an Art and Industrial Arts curriculum have been introduced. Guidance, library and nursing services are available to all schools along with a varied and enlarged extra curricular program.
